Catholic Queries

Q. On the Sunday following Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Of all the members of the Holy Family, I feel I know the least about Joseph. What does Holy Scripture tell us about him? (Part 1)

A. Surprisingly, the Gospel of Mark does not mention Joseph at all, while the Gospel of John mentions Joseph only indirectly, stating simply that Jesus is his son (John 1:45, John 6:42). Therefore, we must focus on the Gospels of Matthew and Luke to learn as much as we possibly can about the human father of Jesus.

In the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel, we learn that Joseph is a descendant of King David (v. 6), that he is the son of Jacob (v. 16), that he was betrothed to Mary but not living with her when she learned that she was pregnant (v. 18), that he was a righteous man who did not want to expose Mary to shame and therefore decided to divorce her quietly (v. 19), that the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and explained that Mary's child was conceived by the Holy Spirit (v. 20), that Mary would have a son and that they should name him Jesus because he was going to save people from their sins (v. 21), that he obeyed the angel and took Mary as his wife (v. 24), and that he did not have marital relations with Mary before she bore Jesus (v. 25).

In the second chapter of Matthew's Gospel, we learn that the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and told him to flee to Egypt with Mary and their child since King Herod intended to kill Jesus (v. 13), that he obeyed the angel and departed for Egypt at night (v. 14), that the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream after the death of Herod and told him that it was safe to return from Egypt (vv. 19 and 20), that he obeyed the angel and returned to Israel with Mary and Jesus (v. 21), that he was warned in another dream that Herod's son Archelaus had assumed the throne of Judea, and since he was afraid to return there, he went to Galilee instead (v. 22), and that he settled his family in the town of Nazareth (v. 23).

After Chapter 2, Matthew makes no further mention of Joseph, although he does describe Jesus as a carpenter's son in Matthew 13:55.

Next week's column will outline the passages within the Gospel of Luke that pertain to Joseph, then discuss the reasons why scripture scholars believe that Joseph never is mentioned during the adult ministry of Jesus.

Reflection Corner



The Nativity of the Lord

We are so used to the Christmas story that sometimes the nuances of the Gospels fly past us. We tend to mash together Matthew's and Luke's separate accounts as though they were one continuous narrative. But that's not the case. Each was written for a very different audience and purpose. And each contains very different elements. Since there was no video recorder running at the time of Jesus' birth, it is easy to see how the stories can be so varied. After all, if you and your cousins all sat down and each one wrote about the day of your grandfather's birth, you'd likely come up with very different accounts. It was about seventy years after Jesus was born that Matthew and Luke wrote their Gospels. You could have some fun this holiday season sitting down and reading the first two chapters of each Gospel as a family, and seeing how many differences you can come up with.

It is John's Gospel, written even later, that gives us one more perspective on Christmas. The beginning of his Gospel is prescribed for the Mass on Christmas Day, although the familiar story from Luke is often substituted. In a beautiful poem, John tells us that the Word of God became flesh and made his dwelling among us and we saw his glory. That's pretty heady language to describe the birth of a baby in a stable. John insists, we saw God's glory! Have we? Have we seen God's glory in the person across the aisle in church? What about the neighbor down the road? Or the family member we don't get along with? Or the person who may have harmed us?

Now that the Word of God has become flesh and made his dwelling among us, have we seen God's glory in those who are the flesh and blood we encounter each day?
