St. Bernadette School

Technology & Pre-K

At St. Bernadette the Pre-Kindergarten students are preparing to join the technology wave of the twenty-first century. The students attend school 5 mornings a week and participate in many specials, including Music, Physical Education, Spanish, Library, and Computer Lab. Computer skills will be increasingly important as the students continue to grow. Our class is the start to a solid foundation that will prepare them for future success.

We start by learning about computer etiquette. This includes rules and guidelines concerning food and drink, how to sit correctly, and what to do if something incorrect appears on your screen.

Next we learned about the parts of the computer, such as the monitor or screen, the keyboard, and the mouse.

One of the biggest challenges for four and five year olds is mouse control. This is very different from most other fine motor skills mastered at this age, like tracing, coloring, and cutting, because they have to look at the screen not their hands. To help build mouse control we played online games that tie into our curriculum. These games help us learn to click, double-click, and drag-and-drop items.

Once we developed some competence using the mouse we began to work on using the drawing tools to create pictures. We have been working in a program called Tux Paint. We started by drawing lines of different colors to make patterns. We drew a simple turkey and practiced changing the width of the line to make his feathers. Then we started using the shape tools to draw pictures. We drew a circle for a plate and used the stamps to add healthy food. We drew a triangle for a Christmas tree with circle ornaments and rectangle presents. We drew circles stacked on top of each other to make a snowman, and added eyes, a nose, a mouth, a scarf, buttons, and arms.

We can now type our names on our pictures, and even use the shift key to capitalize the first letter. As we continue to learn the letters we will work on more typing skills.

Technology increases student interest, reinforces classroom learning, and is a valuable tool for students of today and tomorrow. I enjoy opening the world of technology to my students, and I hope to expand the opportunities as more technology tools become available to us.

Catholic Queries

Q. A co-worker who attends what he calls a "Bible believing church" constantly questions the Catholic practice of infant baptism. He cites the fact that Jesus was baptized as an adult (Matthew 3:13, Mark 1:9, Luke 3:21), as well as passages such as Acts 2:38 ("Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit"). How might I respond to him? (Part 2)

A. Last week's column began by pointing out the sadly ironic truth that, had it not been for the Catholic Church, there would be no Bible for "Bible believing" churches to use as a means of questioning the doctrines and practices of the Catholic Church. The column continued by quoting several passages of Sacred Scripture in which entire households and families were baptized, some of which may indeed have included infants. This week's column continues by listing several passages of scripture in which Jesus responds to the faith of those who intercede on behalf of others, a direct parallel to the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infant being baptized (emphasis added).

"They came bringing to him a paralytic carried by four men. Unable to get near Jesus because of the crowd, they opened up the roof above him. After they had broken through, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, 'Child, your sins are forgiven.'" (Matthew 2:3-5)

"When he entered Capernaum, a centurion approached him and appealed to him, saying, 'Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, suffering dreadfully.' He said to him, 'I will come and cure him.' The centurion said in reply, 'Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word and my servant will be healed...' When Jesus heard this, he was amazed and said to those following him, 'Amen, I say to you, in no one in Israel have I found such faith...' And Jesus said to the centurion, 'You may go; as you have believed, let it be done for you.' And at that very hour his servant was healed." (Matthew 8:5-13)

"They brought the boy to him. And when he saw him, the spirit immediately threw the boy into convulsions...Then (Jesus) questioned his father, 'How long has this been happening to him?' He replied, 'Since childhood. It has often thrown him into fire and into water to kill him. But if you can do anything, have compassion on us and help us.' Jesus said to him, 'If you can! Everything is possible to one who has faith.' Then the boy's father cried out, 'I do believe, help my unbelief!' Jesus, on seeing a crowd rapidly gathering, rebuked the unclean spirit and said to it, 'Mute and deaf spirit, I command you: come out of him and never enter him again!' Shouting and throwing the boy into convulsions, it came out." (Mark 9:20-26)

Reflection Corner



Do you believe that you are supposed to be Christ in this world today? You're baptized in his name. You call yourself a Christian. You sign yourself with holy water and make the sign of the cross. Do you really believe that the Spirit of God is upon you?

Sometimes it's hard to conceive that. We can get ourselves into a baptismal inferiority complex: I'm not good enough to think that I can be Christ in this world. Only extraordinarily holy people-saints-can be like Christ. Thinking like that can lead to baptismal suicide-drowning in the waters of baptism without ever experiencing the power of the Resurrection. Paul doesn't mince any words this week when he tells the Corinthians, "You are Christ's body." He can say that because we have all been given of the one Spirit.

So, if you're baptized you have the Spirit of God, just like Jesus in today's Gospel. That Spirit of God sends us to bring good news to the poor, "to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free."

WOW! What a task. It sounds impossible. As a matter of fact, it is-if we tried to do it alone. But we don't have to. We can do all those things-and more-because we are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, through one Spirit. How we work that out in each community is part of the discernment of the Spirit that takes place, discovering the best ways to use each person's talents and gifts. God's Spirit is given for the common good, and it is in the community of faith that each of us discovers the ways that God wants us to fulfill our baptismal call.

Mission News
