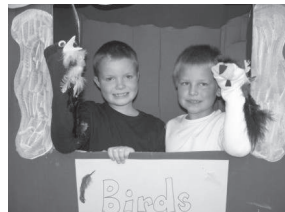

Catholic Queries

Q. The recent articles that outlined the doctrine of Purgatory and its basis in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition were very interesting. Personally, I found the passage from 2 Maccabees 12:39-46 to be the most compelling. However, my Protestant friends claim that the seven deuterocanonical books of the Old Testament, including 2 Maccabees, are not canonical because they are not included in the Jewish Old Testament. How might I respond to this claim?

A. As has been mentioned previously in this column, the seven deuterocanonical books are Tobit, Judith, 1 Maccabees, 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach and Baruch. They are considered sacred and canonical by the Catholic Church, but not by Protestant Christians.

When discussing this matter, it is very important to note that the most widely used source of scripture at the time of Jesus was the Septuagint, a Greek translation of the Old Testament. In fact, the vast majority of Old Testament passages quoted within the New Testament come from the Septuagint, which had exactly the same books as the modern Catholic Old Testament, including the deuterocanonical books.

However, at some point early in the Christian era (some scholars cite the Council of Jamnia in approximately 90 AD), Jewish authorities made a decision to officially define and close their canon of scripture. They apparently used four criteria in doing so: the books had to be in harmony with the Torah (the first five books of the Bible, also known as the Pentateuch); they had to be written no later than the time of the prophet Ezra (approximately 400 BC); they had to be written in Hebrew; and they had to be written in the Holy Land. Each of the seven deuterocanonical books "fails" on one or more the final three criteria listed above.

An extremely important point to remember when debating this issue is that the Jewish authorities of this time period, in addition to excluding the deuterocanonical books of the Old Testament, also excluded all 27 books of the New Testament. As a result, any Protestant who considers the decision of these Jewish authorities to be binding on them also must exclude the New Testament as part of Sacred Scripture!

After pointing this out to your Protestant friends, I suggest you ask them a related follow-up question: "If you accept as binding the decision of the Catholic Church regarding the canon of the New Testament, why do you not consider as binding its decision regarding the canon of the Old Testament, since it decided both of these canons simultaneously?"

Reflection Corner



Today's Gospel reading from Mark actually contains two lessons. The first is a warning; Jesus asks us to beware of those who promote themselves using religion as a catapult for their own selfish desires. The second lesson speaks to faith and charity. As Jesus and his disciples watched the donations being given to the synagogue's treasury, they noted that the wealthy gave large amounts of money and made sure everyone knew it; a poor widow, however, gave all of her wealth (two coins) in silence. It was this woman that Jesus praised; she gave all, the others gave what they could spare.

In giving of our heart to Jesus Christ, do we give all that we have or whatever we feel we can spare? In asking ourselves this question, we would do well to remember that we are one with the body of Christ; we share a communion of charity. Should one suffer, we all suffer; as we give individually, all benefit (CCC 953). The woman with the two coins gave far more than the rich men who made a show of giving a small percentage of their capabilities. As charity is love, remember that we cannot love with only a portion of our hearts, it is all or nothing.

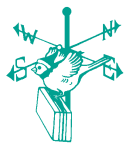


Prayer Shawl Ministry Bake Sale
