Further details offered for liturgical celebrations during flu season

Some parish leaders have asked for more guidance regarding the Sign of Peace and the Communion Cup during the flu season. At the request of Bishop Ricken, here are some additional materials to consider.

1. If a parishioner is ill, he or she should refrain from attending daily or Sunday Mass for the sake of the common good of the community until flu-like symptoms have passed. As an alternative, a person should set aside time at home for quiet, private devotions and/or observe Mass via radio or television. Mass is broadcast at 5:30 a.m. Sundays on WBAY-TV (ABC) or EWTN (cable).
2. All parishioners should observe particularly scrupulous hygiene in the regular washing of hands not only in connection with going to church but as a regular routine during the day.
3. Before the commencement of Mass, the congregation should be instructed that the sign of peace does not have to be conducted with a hand shake. During this flu season, people may show the sign of peace in a manner that is most comfortable to them, which may be a nod and the words, "The peace of Christ be with you."
4. Ordinary and extraordinary ministers of communion should always use an antiseptic hand sanitizer before distributing communion. Care should be given to refrain from touching one's mouth or nose after using the sanitizer.
5. The reception of communion in either the form of the consecrated host or the precious blood is the full reception of the body and blood, soul and divinity of Christ. The reception of communion in the form of the blood of Christ from the sacred cup is optional to the communicant. If a communicant does not receive the blood of Christ, he or she should bow to the sacred cup and return to one's seat. Again, each person should use his or her judgment regarding the particular health-risk situation and the common good as to in determining whether to receive communion under one or both species.
6. All parishioners should be encouraged through bulletin announcements to get plenty of rest and sleep, eat a nutritious diet, and regularly exercise to minimize the risks of contracting the flu.
7. The Diocesan Department of Education will continue to work closely with the 62 Catholic schools throughout the Diocese to observe practices consistent with the school environment and advisories from the local departments of health.

Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. - Mk 10:51-52



Catholic Queries

Q. A co-worker who is Christian, but not Roman Catholic, insisted that praying the Rosary contradicts Jesus' words in Matthew 6:7 - "But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do" (King James translation). How might I respond to this person?

A. My guess is that your co-worker's objection to the Rosary is the result of focusing on the word "repetitions." However, within the context of the passage from which this verse is drawn (Matthew 6:1-8), it is clear that Jesus intended the focus to be on the word "vain." Throughout this passage, Jesus warns his followers to avoid praying like the hypocrites, for whom prayer simply is a means of personal gain - an attempt to impress others, or even worse, an attempt to impress God, with insincere piety.

With this in mind, you should inform your co-worker that, when recited in an appropriately prayerful spirit, the Rosary certainly does not qualify as a case of vain repetition. Instead, it is a prayerful meditation on one of four sets of five mysteries - Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, or Luminous. Indeed, Pope Paul VI has proclaimed that the Rosary is "an epitome of the whole Gospel."

If your co-worker still isn't convinced, you should point out that there are numerous examples of repetitive prayer in Sacred Scripture. For example, Jesus told the parable of the persistent widow in Luke 18:1-8. The widow repeatedly insisted that her rights be enforced by a corrupt judge, after which the judge finally relented. Jesus then asks His followers "Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night?" (Luke 18:7)

St. Paul encourages us to "Pray without ceasing" in 1 Thessalonians 5:17, yet includes no qualification to avoid repetition while doing so.

In the book of Revelation, John writes about his vision in which the four living creatures praise God unceasingly. "Day and night they do not stop exclaiming: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God almighty, who was, and who is, and who is to come.'" (Revelation 4:8)

And finally, Jesus Himself, in the midst of uttering His most fervent prayer during the Agony in the Garden, repeated the same petition three times (Matthew 26:39, 42, and 44). I am sure your co-worker would not accuse Jesus of using vain repetition in this case! So, to solidify your point, as well as to bring it back full circle, inform your co-worker that the Agony in the Garden also happens to be the first Sorrowful Mystery of the Rosary!

Bartimaeus figured that he had nothing to lose; blind since birth, he had heard that Jesus was preaching to a crowd nearby. Knowing in his heart that Jesus was truly the Son of God, Bartimaeus went to Jesus, and interrupting his sermon asked Jesus to cure his blindness. Jesus' compassion for a man who had such faith without seeing led him to grant his wish. If we can have faith in Jesus without ever having seen or heard him, will we realize a "once in a lifetime chance"?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, teaching on faith, states: "[A] disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it" (CCC 1816). Bartimaeus not only possessed great faith in Jesus, he was unashamed and unafraid to call out to his Savior in front of the many people around him. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus said, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." Today, if you meet someone who needs the loving arms of Jesus Christ, take that chance to share his promise of everlasting life.
